Facility Naming Program

Recognition for Major Gifts



New and existing facilities may be named in recognition of donors to the College, Educational Foundation, or Scholarship Foundation.

The SCC District makes facilities naming available to recognize significant monetary contributions. Naming recognition may also be considered for an individual or a business or organization who has made a significant contribution of time, effort, or service to SCC Solano Community College District.

The Superintendent-President's Office and the SCC Educational Foundation publish recommended contributions for specific areas. A financial gift shall not automatically result in the naming of a building or area. The final decision is made by the SCC District Board of Trustees. Below are typical examples of the financial contribution required:

- Individual seat plaques typically start at \$250-\$500.
- Naming of offices and study rooms begins at \$2,500.
- Naming of classrooms and meeting rooms is typically from \$10,000 to \$100,000.
- Major spaces and labs or campus areas such as patios, lobbies, sports fields, the bookstore, or cafeteria begins at \$100,000 to \$250,00.
- Existing buildings may be named, such as the library or gymnasium on the main campus or other buildings at any SCC location. These require gifts above \$1-5M.

Each naming recognition must be consistent with mission and goals of Solano Community College. The District Governing Board must approve the facility name upon a recommendation of the College Superintendent-President in consultation with the SCC Educational Foundation and/or SCC Scholarship Foundation as appropriate.



Recent Construction and Renovation Projects

Library and Learning Resource Center

This 59,000 sq. ft. building replaced the Library on the Fairfield campus.
Construction was completed in May 2021.

Performing Arts Center Renovation

Completed Fall 2017 and includes a modernization, lobby expansion, and facade upgrades.

Automotive Technology Building

Completed Fall 2017, this Vallejo project is home to SCC's largest career-tech program.

Biotech and Science Building Completed Fall 2017 at the SCC Vacaville Center, this building houses the new Bachelor's Degree Program.

Science and Veteran's Center This stateof-the-art 44,000 sq. ft. Fairfield campus project was dedicated in August 2019.

Biomanufacturing Program



One of 15 Programs in California

- The California State legislature approved SB 850 in 2014, authorizing 15 (of 116) community colleges in California to establish baccalaureate degrees.
- After a competitive application process, Solano Community College was approved in May 2015 to offer a Bachelor's of Science Degree in Biomanufacturing. The first students graduating SCC with a Bachelor's degree was the class of 2019.
- Biomanufacturing means growing living cells
 (bacterial, yeast, and animal cells) in large tanks
 called bioreactors and inducing them to produce a
 protein that serves as a medicine. That protein then
 must be separated from other cellular components
 and purified by using techniques that exploit its
 properties to isolate it away from other cellular
 proteins. Then technicians use analytical techniques
 to prove the purity of the isolated protein.
- Solano College's program emphasizes practical, hands-on training to emulate the work environment. Students follow Standard Operating Procedures, fill out Batch Production Records, and simulate Good Manufacture Practice practices demanded by the Food and Drug Administration.

Total tuition for the Bachelor's of Science Degree (all four years) is approximately \$10,000.00, allowing many SCC students to graduate without studnet loan debt.


- Lower division courses \$46 per unit.

A Track Record of Success

Since July 2013, with the help of individual and corporate donors, SCCEF has provided \$2.3M to support the College, including \$489,000 for student scholarships, \$105,000 for the Athletic Department and \$58,000 for the Alumni Association. Additionally, the Foundation generated \$510,000 to produce outreach and fundraising events to assist the College, and SCCEF retains approximately \$547,000 in restricted accounts immediately available for nearly 100 College departments, programs., and student clubs.
